retrieval
quiz

- *Quizzes can be useful tools to enable children's long-term learning. Because quizzes ask children to recall information and use it, they can be useful retrieval practice for children.*



step-by-step

- *Breaking the task into small steps makes it manageable, makes it more memorable, allows the student to make steady progress, feel success and can achieve their full potential*



checkpoint

- *Checkpoint questions are planned questions written prior to the lesson with a specific goal of assessing all pupils' understanding and thinking at that point. The responses to the checkpoint question guide the teacher as to what the next stage of the lesson should be and whether to recap or move on.*

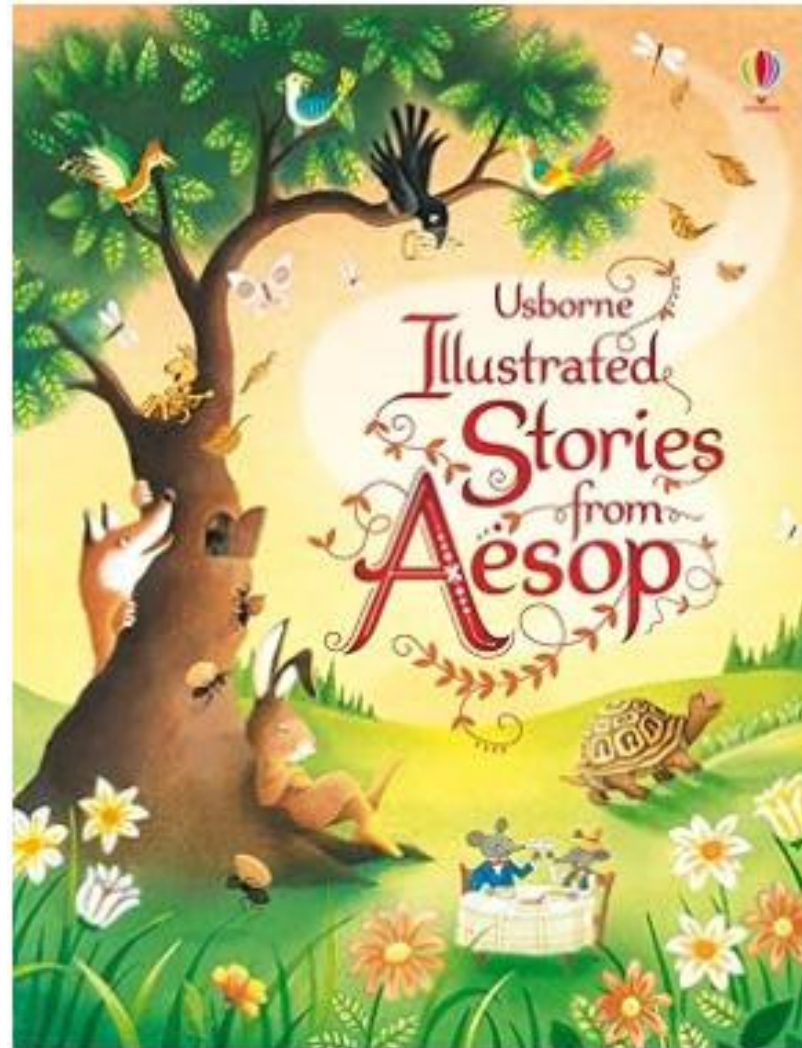

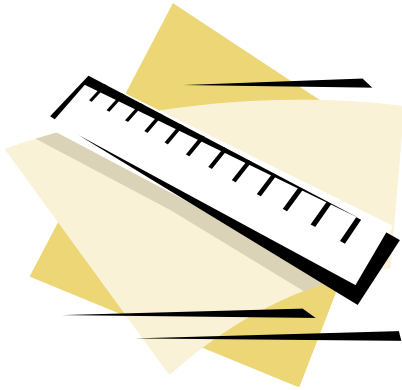


Classroom Equipment

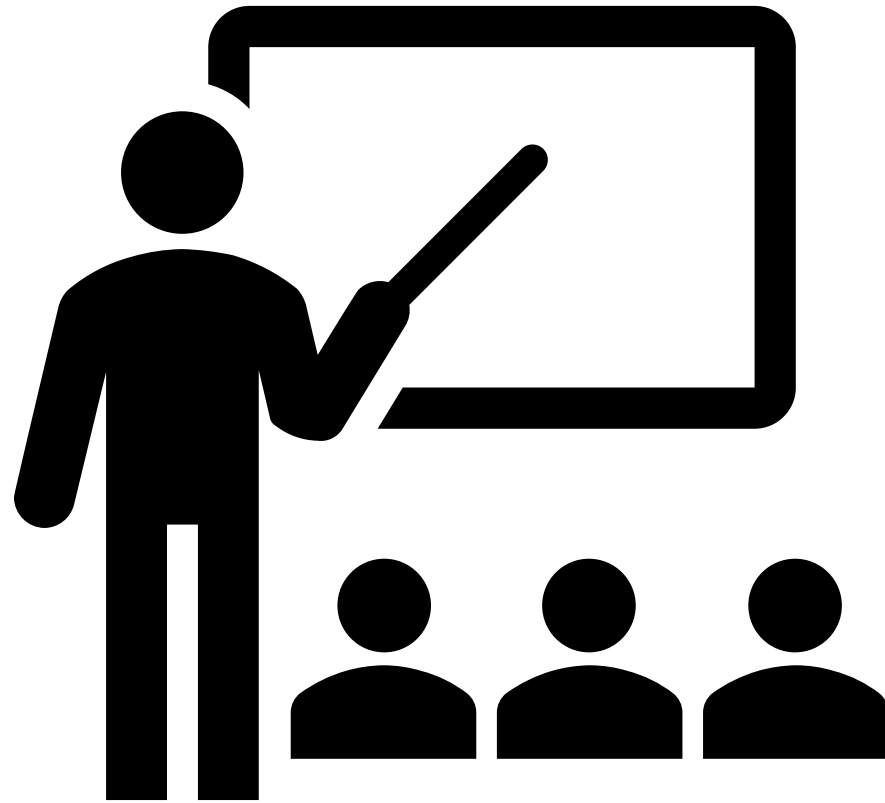

Stage One (blue card)

- Lack of cooperation or poor attitude towards adults
- Ignoring instructions
- Disturbing the learning of others
- Interrupting or interfering
- Shouting out
- Behaving in an unsafe way such as swinging on a chair/running in the corridors
- Being rude or unkind to other children
- Not meeting an academy expectation

Stage Two (yellow card)

- Repeated unacceptable behaviours from Stage 1
- Refusing to follow the instructions of a member of staff
- Rough or dangerous play

Stage Three (red card)

- Repeated unacceptable behaviours from Stage 2
- Dangerous behaviour such hitting, kicking, violence, using equipment in a way that endangers others
- Harassment or discriminatory behaviour of any type towards other children or adults
- Neglect or causing damage to another child's or academy property
- Rudeness and disrespectful attitude shown towards staff
- Swearing or using inappropriate language or gestures
- Spitting with intention
- Leaving the classroom/ designated area without permission

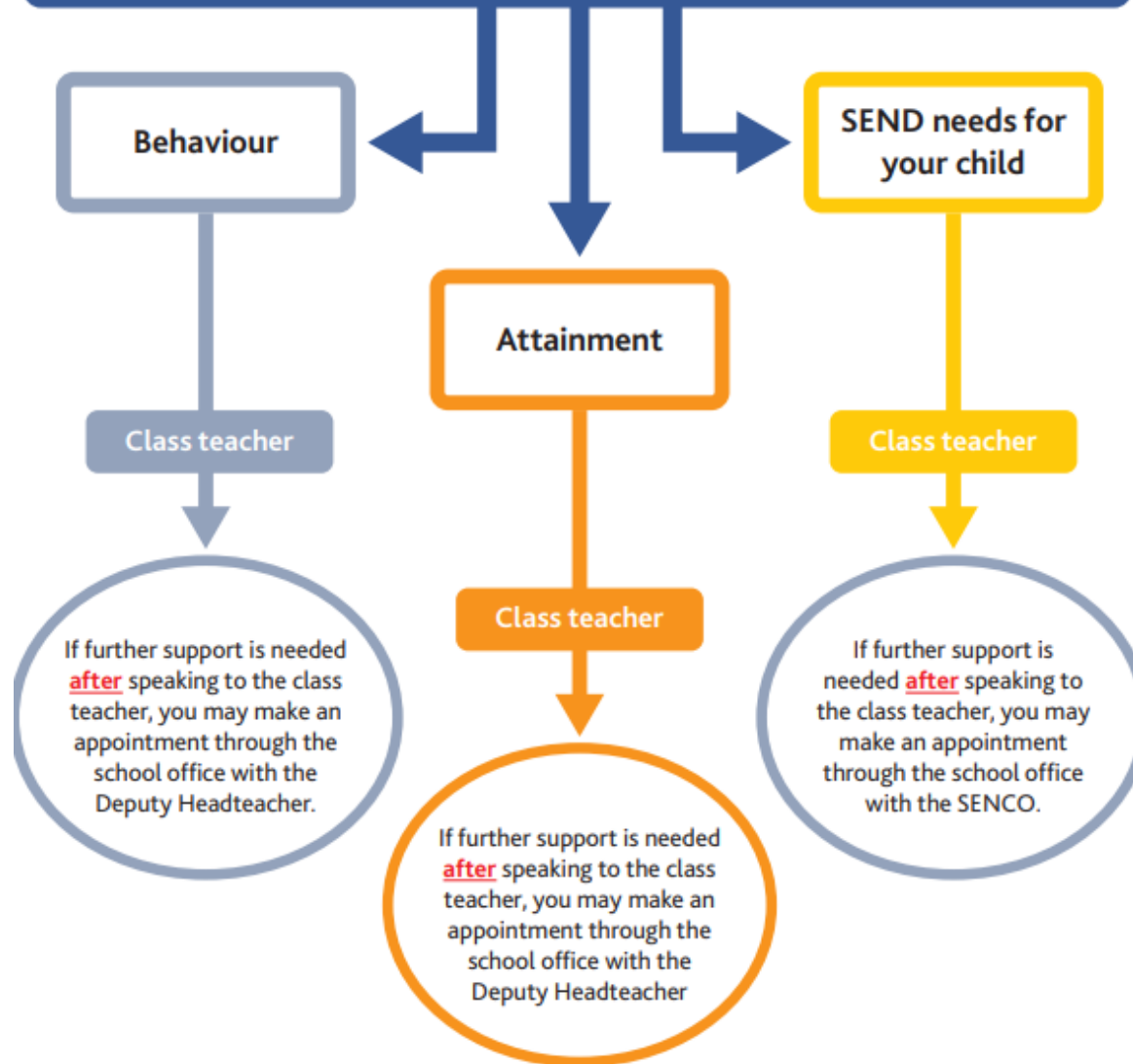

Is your child starting school in September 2027?

If your child was born between 1 September 2022 and 31 August 2023, you will need to apply for a school place between **2 November 2026** and **15 January 2027**.

Is your child in year 2?

If your child attends an infant school you will need to apply for a place at a junior school or a primary school with a year 3 intake.

Important dates

2 November 2026

You can apply online for a school place.

15 January 2027

Closing date for primary applications but we welcome early applications.

16 April 2027

Primary outcomes will be sent by post or email. If you applied online, you will receive an email in the evening with the outcome and you can also view your school offer online.

By 30 April 2027

You must confirm whether you wish to accept or decline the place you have been offered.

By 17 May 2027

If you wish to appeal for a community or voluntary controlled school listed on your form, you should submit it by this date so that it can be heard by 19 July 2027. Other schools may have different appeal deadlines.



How do I apply?

- The quickest and easiest way to apply for a school place is online. Visit surreycc.gov.uk/admissions to access the application form and more information on the application process and admission arrangements for Surrey schools. It is important that you consider this information carefully when you make your application.
- You can start your online application any time from 2 November 2026 but you must have completed it by **15 January 2027**.
- Once you have submitted your application you will receive a confirmation email.
- On **16 April 2027** you will receive an email with the outcome of your application.
- You will need to accept or decline your offer of a school place online by **30 April 2027**.
