# Curriculum overview for Reception

## Personal, Social and Emotional <u>Development</u>

This half term is all about settling into the school environment with a focus on independence and the classroom rules.

The theme is 'Being Me in My World' which covers how it feels to belong and be part of a group along with a focus on their feelings and emotions.

#### Literacy

'Essential Letters and Sounds' (ELS) is used to develop our children's early reading and writing skills. The children learn 4 sounds each week and are currently working within Phase 2. They are also learning 'Harder to Read and Spell Words' (HRWs) which cannot be sounded out.



To enhance and embed a love of stories, the children will spend time exploring, learning and asking questions about a story. The key texts will be Elmer by David McKee, Hair Love by Matthew Cherry and Handy Work by Julia Donaldson.

#### **Mathematics**

Maths this term will include the following areas:

Match, Sort and Compare: the children will find and group objects which match and investigate different ways of grouping them.

Measure and Pattern: The children will compare the size, mass and capacity of objects to say which is greater or smaller.

It's Me, 1,2,3: The children will explore numbers 1-3, recognising sets and dots of these numbers and different ways of making 1,2 and 3.

Recognising circles and triangles.

### Physical Development

The children will be learning how to move confidently and safely in different ways, such as walking, running, and skipping. They'll also be developing their coordination and balance by exploring how to travel in, on, over, and around various pieces of equipment.

Through fine motor activities the children will develop their scissor control and pencil grip. They will take part in activities to strengthen their hands and fingers such as using tweezers and pegs.

#### Communication and Language

The communication and language focus this half term is all around settling into school and how the children can use their words to explain their feelings and make friends.

The children will also be working on their listening skills by playing lots of games inside and outside to encourage them to follow simple instructions.

#### **Understanding the World**

The children will be thinking about how they have changed as they have grown, talking about what they can do now compared to what they could do in the past. They will be thinking about their families and how old they are compared to other family members.

The children will be observing the changes that take place in autumn. They will have the opportunity to go outside and look for signs of autumn. They will think about how the change in weather effects animals and learning about animals that hibernate.

#### **Expressive Arts and Design**

In music the children will be listening to various pieces of music and talking about why they like or dislike them.

They will sing and perform familiar nursery rhymes identifying the pulse and add their own sounds using their body or instruments.

During their time in Rainbow class the children's development will be recorded in an on-line Learning Journal called 'Tapestry'. Photographs, achievements and progress statements are entered into their Learning Journal which is available for parents to access through a password protected login. Parents are able to contribute to their child's Learning Journal by adding photographs and comments.

### Observations

In Early Years the staff will be looking at what your child is doing and will create observations using words, documents, pictures and/or video clips which record these learning moments. These may also be flagged against areas of learning, and aspects, from a range of guidance materials that they could be using to support your child's development.

You are also able to add things that your child does at home using observations of your own, such as talking about what they see on a walk or completing a model over a period of time, and these will all help the staff make an accurate judgement. With Tapestry, you can easily add your own observations using the app or the browser.

# Do you have a child starting reception class?

If so, your child will participate in the reception baseline assessment (RBA) within the first 6 weeks of starting reception. The purpose of the assessment is to provide the starting point for a progress measure that will help parents understand how well schools support their pupils to progress between reception and year 6.

### What is the RBA?

The RBA is a short, interactive and practical assessment of your child's early literacy, communication, language and mathematics skills when they begin school.

# What does participating in the RBA mean for my child?

The main purpose is to create a starting point to measure the progress schools make with their pupils. It is not about judging or labelling your child or putting them under any pressure. Your child cannot 'pass' or 'fail' the assessment.

The RBA gives your child valuable one to one time with their teacher at an early stage, helping them to understand your child better. It provides a helpful snapshot of your child's skills and abilities when they enter reception, allowing teachers to support your child in the most appropriate way.




















Please ensure the children have their PE kits in school on the day their class has PE:


